Hearing God's Voice

John 10:3-5. "The doorkeeper opens the gate for this man, and the sheep hear his voice and pay attention to it. And know that they listen he calls his own sheep by name and leads them out to pasture.

When he has brought all his own sheep outside, he walks on ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice and recognize his call.

They will never follow a stranger, but will run away from him, because they do not know the voice of strangers."

How do we know that the voice in our head is giving us direction or that those nudges are God? How can we be sure it's now our own mind wanting us to go in a particular direction?

As believers it is our right and our privilege to know God's voice. The Bible tells us that we can know his voice and distinguish it from others. We can discern if it is God, our own will or if it is the voice of deception.

John 10 tells us about the sheep and the voice of their shepherd. The sheep know their Shepard's voice. They know their Shepard's voice because they are with him all the time. They are listening to and for him all the time. They are trained to run from another voice.

If we want to be sure that we are hearing God's voice we have to "train our ear". We have to be constantly listening for God. We need to be spending time in the Word of God. The Word of God is where we learn God's nature. We learn about who He is.

If we want to have confidence that we are hearing God's voice we have to develop our relationship with Him.

If you want to hear God and avoid the spirit of error...get into God's word. Pray. The more we study and learn, the more the power of God will flow through our lives.

The more time we spend with God....the easier it is to hear Him. Read your Bible, get a devotional, join a study, lead a study...look for opportunities to get to know God better and be in His presence.

Becoming the Body of Christ FEBRUARY 14–20, 2022 KATHY KHANG Genesis 45:3-11, 15 Psalm 37:1-11, 39-40 1 Corinthians 15:35-38, 42-50 Luke 6:27-38

SCRIPTURE OVERVIEW: Joseph had experienced betrayal by his brothers and then had been sold into slavery. At the time, he no doubt felt abandoned by God. However, after God raises up Joseph in Egypt, Joseph is able to provide for his family in a time of drought. Although others have acted with evil intentions, God uses those actions for good. The psalmist offers a similar encouragement. We struggle in the real challenges that face us, but we believe in a God who can carry us through them. In First Corinthians, Paul explains that God carries us even through death to resurrection glory on the other side. Jesus teaches us to respond to evil with mercy. Because we believe in a God who will ultimately bring justice, we do not need to serve as judge and executioner.

The Call to Love and Serve FEBRUARY 21–27, 2022 MARY C. EARLE Exodus 34:29-35 Psalm 99 2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2 Luke 9:28-36 (37-43)

SCRIPTURE OVERVIEW: God's glory is always revealed, even if never completely. When Moses encounters God on the mountain, his face undergoes a physical transformation as a reflection of God's greater glory. The psalmist reminds us of how great God is and how even Moses and Aaron bow before God's throne. Paul refers to the story of Moses, but because of Christ, God's glory is now more openly revealed. There is no need to wear a covering as Moses did, for Christ reflects openly the divine radiance. Luke recounts the Transfiguration, when the face of Jesus, like that of Moses, begins to shine. God's voice reinforces the revelation of the Transfiguration, declaring Jesus to be God's Son and the revelation of God's glory.

SCRIPTURE OVERVIEW: As we begin the season of Lent, the readings provide several images of how we might prepare our hearts. Deuteronomy focuses on gratitude with a recitation of the history of God's faithfulness. The people are instructed to offer their gifts to God as a response to God's generosity. The psalmist focuses on faithfulness. If we put our confidence in God, God will protect and sustain us. In Romans, Paul emphasizes faith. Our confession of faith from the mouth should come from the heart, and this heart confession saves us. The story of the temptation of Jesus admonishes us to know biblical truth. The devil tempts Jesus with half-truths—even scriptural quotes—but Jesus counters with correct understanding of God's Word and God's character.
