



I am writing to tell you about an amazing opportunity that I have been given to serve the Lord once again on a mission trip to minister to children in India from July 24th to August 5th this year. I will be traveling with an organization called Orphan Outreach and they are committed to serving orphans and vulnerable children around the world. In 2018 I served on my first mission trip with Orphan Outreach. You can learn more about the ministry of Orphan Outreach on their website at www.orphanoutreach.org.

As a mission trip participant, I will serve children and their families by providing essentials of care and sustainable support to ensure the children and families are strengthened. Our main purpose is to build relationships to show each child that he or she is loved unconditionally and is special in the eyes of our Heavenly Father.

I can't do this on my own. I need the support of friends and family in my life to make this happen. I am thankful for your influence in my life and would love for you to be a part of this mission trip with me. One of the ways you can help me is to pray for the ministry we will perform and for me personally. Please pray that all work would be done according to God's will and for His glory. Also pray for the children we will serve, for unity among my team, and for the details of our travel and itinerary.

If you would like to give financially, the individual cost of the trip is \$5300.
