#### **Abiding in God**

AUGUST 16–22, 2021 1 Kings 8:(1, 6, 10-11) 22-30, 41-43 Psalm 84 Ephesians 6:10-20 John 6:56-69

SCRIPTURE OVERVIEW: God had prevented David from building a temple in Jerusalem but then permitted David's son Solomon to build it. In First Kings, Solomon places the ark of the covenant in the holiest place, and God's presence descends. The psalmist rejoices in the Temple and would rather be in its courts than anywhere else because that is where God dwells. The New Testament readings remind us that the people of God have always met with resistance. The author of Ephesians compares living the Christian life to going into battle, so we must be prepared. Jesus also meets with resistance in John. His teachings are too hard for many to accept, so they abandon him. When we face resistance. therefore, we should not be surprised; but we are also not alone. the bread offered in Exodus. Not only will it fulfill needs on earth; it will offer a life not yet imagined—a life where hunger is not a concern. The manna of the Israelites is a landmark of God's faithfulness, so for Jesus to assert that he can offer the same gifts of the manna and more is revolutionary. Jesus offers not only life but life everlasting to those who are faithful. Manna from Heaven, you rescued the Israelites from famine. You offer eternal life to your followers. You save your believers from death. Satisfy us, enliven us, fortify us so that we may bring your holy vision to earth, offering sustenance to those who need it most. In the name of the Living Bread. Amen.

#### Tending the Soil of Your Heart for the Fruit of Your Life

AUGUST 23–29, 2021 Song of Solomon 2:8-13 Psalm 45:1-2, 6-9 James 1:17-27 Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

SCRIPTURE OVERVIEW: The poetry of Song of Solomon is thick with romantic imagery, and most scholars agree that these lines mean what they say on the surface; they are written from the author to the beloved. Psalm 45 echoes the refrain of admiration and desire. Such desire is not wrong if it is awakened at the proper time, as the author of Song of Solomon says elsewhere. James argues that ethical living is done not in word but in deed. True religion is not putting on a show but displaying mercy and controlling the tongue. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus rebukes some of the religious leaders on this very account because they talk of obedience to God but do not live it out. What we say and what we do should match.

### From the Food Pantry:

I am very happy to volunteer as the "Food Pantry Coordinator". As most on you know the pantry has been dear to my heart for many years and I look forward to seeing what God's plan for blessing the clients who come. I know He has already blessed me with stories. I want to share with you my first experience this week. Last Tuesday I began contemplating the position. I came to the pantry for the first time in over a year. I was amazed at how empty the shelves were. There were no canned goods at all. I asked Pastor Maggie why they were empty when there is money to purchase food. Her response was "we lack volunteers who can or will go shopping." My heart sank. I know it takes many people to keep the pantry running and stocked. I knew I wanted to help. So I volunteered to pick up the Wednesday Aldis donation. You can imagine my surprise when the Aldis clerk came out pushing a cart toward me with 6 cases of canned goods. Tears came to my eyes and all I could say was thank you God! I had forgotten how rewarding doing the work of the church was. It takes so many volunteers to do the work of the pantry. We need people to man the pantry, people to pick up and deliver donations to the church, people to divide and bag food, to label bags with the date and product listed. #### Christian Education Sunday - August 22, 2021

Gifts to the annual Christian Education Sunday offering are used to provide mini-grants supporting faith formation efforts in local churches across Michigan.

Christian Education Sunday is one of the special observances set by The Michigan Conference. This year it is celebrated on August 22 (or a Sunday of your choice).

### Why is Christian Education Sunday important?

First, supporting local churches in faith formation (Christian Education) is vital in making disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. One way this happens is through empowering and equipping local churches and leaders. Your church can celebrate Christian Education Sunday (or another name of your choosing) to communicate how your church engages in faith formation

Second, Christian Education Sunday provides the opportunity to support faith formation around the conference through the Christian Education Sunday offering. Donations support grants for local churches, training for leaders, resources, and much more.

Emerging ministries are exciting! Often seed money is required to launch a new or re-imagined ministry. Grant money is available for Michigan United Methodist churches and related organizations, in part funded by the Christian Education Sunday Offering.

Interested in applying for a grant? Applications for the next cycle are due on November 1, 2021.

These are the funding priorities. Grants will be awarded to new, innovative projects that fulfill the Michigan Conference Purpose and Vision with the following characteristics:

Ministries relating to children (birth through 5th grade) and discipleship ministries (adult, older adult, intergenerational, family, etc.) Ministries related to youth and young adults should contact the Board of Young People's Ministries.

New, emerging, and/or innovative project that makes "...disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the

Address pressing issues impacting the local church, local community, and/or the world.

Plan for evaluating outcomes and the process.

Demonstrated potential for sustainability (i.e. activities will continue beyond the grant).

And others as defined on the grant application

Grant applications will be reviewed by December 1, 2021. Grant applications may also be made March 1, 2022 and July 1, 2022.
